CIRCULAR

Sub:- Information Technology Department – Adherence of Standards for eGovernance -Sharing of Information and seamless interoperability of data across eGovernance applications -reg.

The Government of India has launched the National e-Governance Plan (NeGP) with the intent to support the growth of e-Governance within the country. While the e-Governance initiatives are being taken by various sectors, the same information from an individual is asked for repeatedly in different formats, at different locations, for different purposes, by different applications, running in silos. As a result seamless sharing of data and services among the applications remains a major issue. Standards are sine qua non for interoperability across the e-Governance applications for seamless sharing of data and service.

- 2. The Standards for eGovernance are a high priority activity, which will help ensure sharing of information and seamless interoperability of data across eGovernance applications. A website has been created on the standardization activities http://egovstandards.gov.in. This e-Governance Standards portal provides a platform for sharing of ideas, knowledge, and draft documents among the members of various committees involved in standards formulation process. It also has a provision for web publishing of draft documents for review comments by the Closed User Group and the Public. The duly approved standards by Government's Apex body consisting of Senior Strategic members from: DeitY, NIC, NASSCOM, BIS,CDAC, Planning Commission etc. would be released on this portal for free download and usage. List of all eGov Standards and Guideline notified by DeitY is annexed.
 - 3. Following these standards would make it possible to share information across the applications. In this regard, it is requested that all Government departments and agencies involved in the implementation of eGovernance applications in our state adhere to these standards for building secure and interoperable eGovernance applications which are technology and vendor neutral. It is also advised that in order to make eGovernance applications to be interoperable on various platforms, it would be prudent to ensure that the solutions developed are in conformance with the technology standards notified by DeitY, GoI.
